

To letter in theatre arts a student must:

1. Earn 10 points during the year (2 points may carry over from year to year)
2. Complete any role, assignment or contest for which points are awarded in a quality matter.
3. Maintain a grade of 90 or above in a theatre class to qualify for a letter award.
4. Theatre Arts 1 students are not eligible for a letter.
5. Be a member in good standing in the theatre department and exhibit a positive attitude at all times.

Categories for Earning Points

<u>Points</u>	<u>Activity</u>
2	Supporting role, either acting or technical, meets the above criteria, and spends a minimum of twenty hours outside the school day.
3	Major role, either acting or technical, meets the above criteria, and spends a minimum of twenty hours outside the school day.
2	All UIL One-Act Play cast and crew.
2	All UIL Design Contest students.
1	For each acting or technical award given at the UIL One-Act Play Contest, International Thespian Society (State or National convention), and UIL Academic Tournament-Prose/Poetry
1	For advancing to the state finals in Theatrical Design and for any placement.
1	For the entire cast and crew for each level of advancement during the UIL One-Act Play Contest, the International Thespian Society State and National Convention (Superior Rating) or UIL Academic Competition in Prose and Poetry
1	Working 12 hours of a UIL One-Act Play Contest or designated state organization.
1	Attend 4 LISD main stage/season show.

- A main stage show is defined as one in which royalties are paid (unless a script is public domain), admission is charged (except for UIL One-Act or ITS entries), and acting and Technical elements display superior work of the campus.
- It is the student's responsibility to provide documentation of the hours spent on each main stage show and the theatre teacher's responsibility to certify the hours.
- Each campus theatre teacher must ensure that a student does not receive more than one major award (i.e. letter jacket in theatre in athletics).
- Participation is defined as a competitive acting or technical event at International Thespian Convention.
- UIL Limitation of Awards: A participant school or member school district may give an award not to exceed \$70 in value to a student during that student's high school enrollment at the same school for participation in UIL interschool competition(s) listed in Section 380. Each year a participant school or member school district may give one additional award per student per interschool activity listed in Section 380, not to exceed \$10 each. Schools shall not give the same student both the major and minor awards for the same activity during the same school year.
