

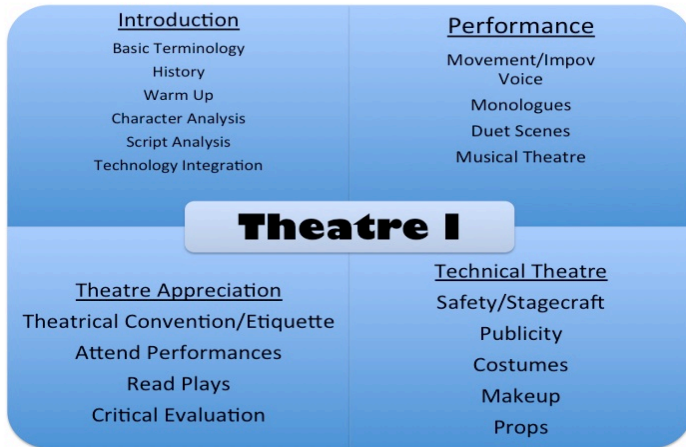
Theatre 1

Play Credit Opportunities

Guidelines/Procedures
